Accommodation and Meals	Accommodation is arranged in on-campus dormitories. Students are placed in single or double-occupancy rooms. Bed linens, blankets and pillows are provided. Wi-Fi is available in a dorm and hotspot on-campus. There is no dormitory meal plan, and so students must cook for themselves. Dormitories are equipped with full kitchen facilities. Estimate (subject to change) of dorm fees: 200,000 yen/semester, or 120,000 yen for the summer program.

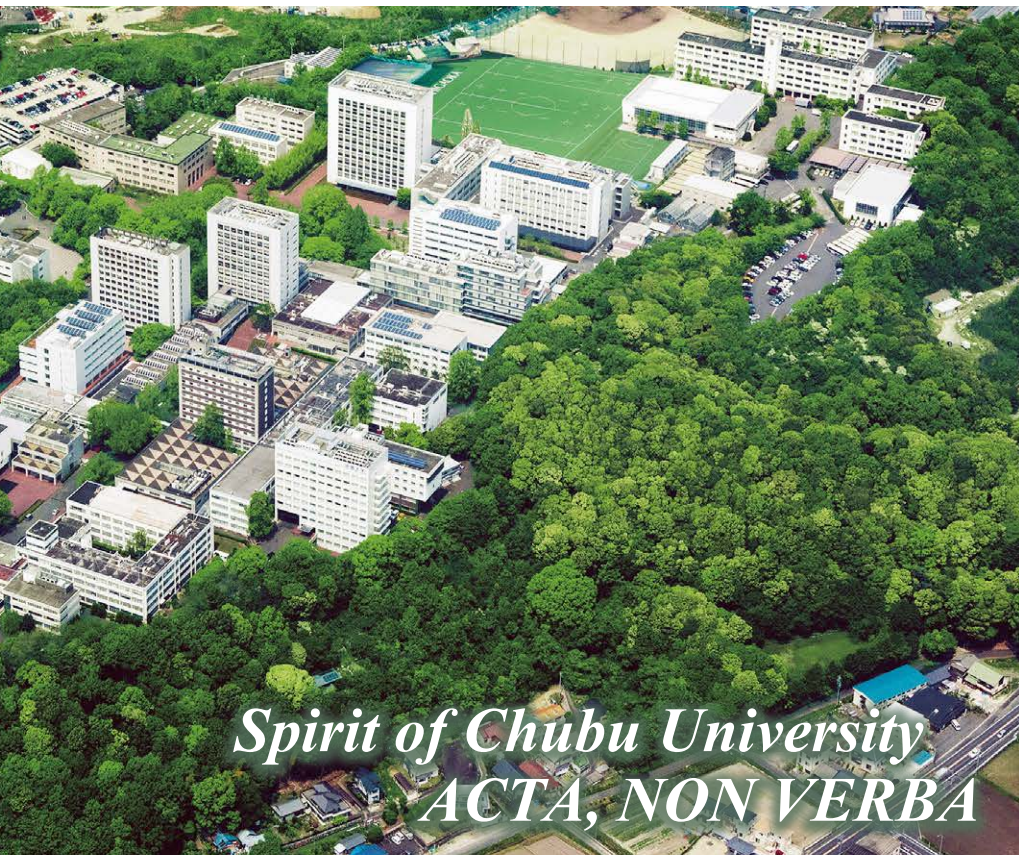

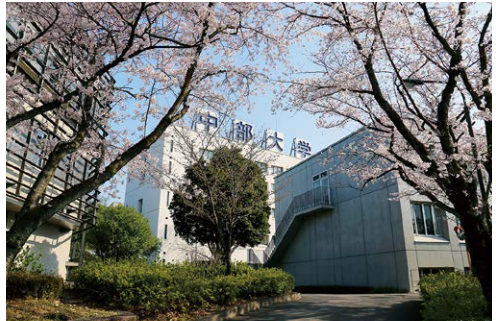

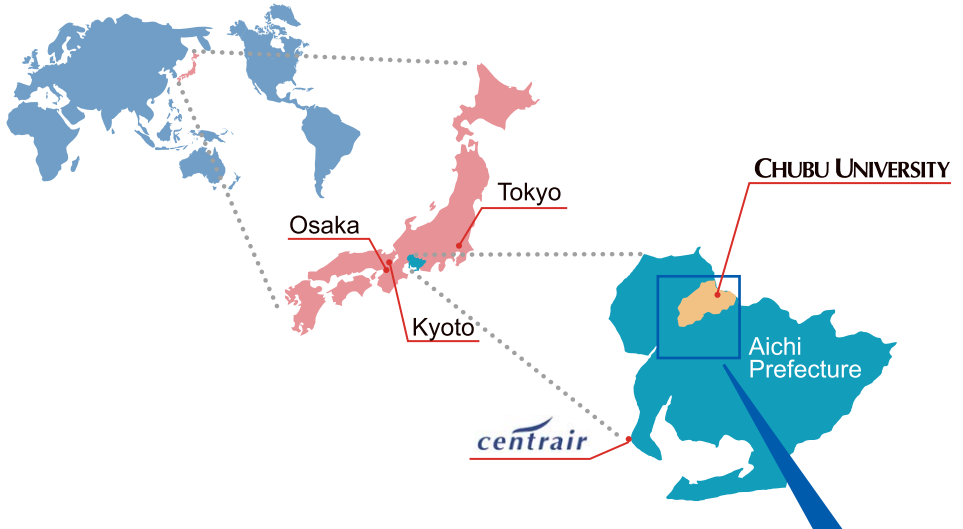
