Procedures

Nomination procedure	<p>The partner institution nominates a student for one or maximum two semesters. The nomination letter should include the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Full name of a nominated student *Gender *Place and country of the home institution *Date of birth and nationality *Email address *Planned period of the study visit *Field of study at the home institution *Study level *Home institution coordinator's name and email address <p>Important information about the inbound mobility at TSU as well as the courses delivered in English can be found here: https://tsu.ge/en/foreign-relations/page/Inbound-Mobility</p>
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Requirements

Student status	<p>At the time of application, an applicant should be at least in his/her second semester and must remain enrolled at the home institution while studying at TSU.</p>
Language proficiency	<p>Partner institutions should nominate students with sufficient language abilities. The minimum language proficiency is B2 level according to the common European Framework of Reference for Languages.</p>
Application procedure	<p>Once the official nomination letter is received from the partner institution, the DFR Inbound Mobility Team will contact the nominee directly for providing details on the mobility procedures and arrangements. DFR serves as a liaison unit responsible for communication between the incoming student/staff and the host faculties/departments at TSU.</p> <p>List of required documents for students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Nomination letter from a responsible unit at the home institution *CV in Europass format *Certificate of registration at the home institution *A copy of the passport *A motivation letter *Foreign language certificate (B2) *Filled and duly signed learning agreement *Transcript of records from previous studies *A work plan (in case of PhD students) *A copy of an international health insurance

Students should agree with their home coordinators on academic plans.

Learning Agreement and course schedule

Students should agree with their home coordinators on the list of courses to be taken during their mobility at TSU. All courses with corresponding numbers of credits (up to 30 ECTS per semester) should be included in the Learning Agreement. Upon student's arrival in Tbilisi DFR Inbound Mobility Team organizes an orientation meeting and information session for incoming students. They are allowed to make changes to their initial Learning Agreements (compiled before the mobility) and modify the document during the first 2 weeks of their academic semester at TSU. The Learning Agreement (before/during the mobility) should be signed by three parties (student, home and host institutions).

<i>Final theses/research projects</i>	<i>Students not taking part in regular academic courses but working on individual research project/thesis should find an academic supervisor at TSU, who agrees to work with them during their stay at TSU. Regular meetings and discussions on development of the project should be arranged. A Confirmation of Stay or a general reference about the implemented mobility should be signed by DFR.</i>
<i>Transcript of records</i>	<i>DFR issues a Transcript of Records for incoming students within 4 weeks once the academic semester is over officially.</i>
<i>Support programme</i>	<i>DFR supervises a mentorship program aiming to help incoming students in successfully navigating thru TSU and offer them a variety of support mechanisms. TSU students with international experience are invited by email to register for the program.</i>

Accommodation

<i>General information</i>	<i>TSU offers accommodation in the University-owned housing complex (Lisi Dormitory) to its international students. Lisi Dormitory is a recently-built complex with the capacity of 320 beds, equipped with all facilities including a library, a conference hall, a medical center, a space for socializing, a laundry room, a computer lab and other infrastructure that are meant to create a comfortable environment to tenants. https://www.tsu.ge/en/foreign-relations/page/2012</i>
<i>Application</i>	<i>DFR Inbound Mobility Team will contact students about the housing options before their arrival in Tbilisi.</i>
<i>Application deadlines</i>	<i>Fall semester</i> <i>10 July</i>

<i>Application confirmation</i>	<i>Inbound Mobility Team will confirm a reservation by replying to an email.</i>
<i>Allocation</i>	<i>Inbound Mobility Team will send the room offers to the students in early September/March which should be confirmed by replying to the email to keep the reservation.</i>

*Orientation day
Welcome event*

Prior to students' arrival, they will receive an email with information about the date of the orientation day. At the event they will meet each other and the team of local mentors. They will also have a chance to listen to brief presentations of academic coordinators of the study program(s). In addition to this meeting, DFR organizes a welcome event to all incoming students each academic semester. It is an excellent opportunity to meet DFR staff and representatives of the units in charge of student services, who give presentations with a lot of useful information on university, student's life, sports and cultural events.

Health insurance

General remarks

Students are responsible for their own health travel/insurance during their time at TSU. They should contact their insurance agency to inquire about international coverage that will be valid on the territory of Georgia. It is required that the insurance includes the costs of COVID-19 treatment.

<i>The Center for Languages</i>	<i>The Center for Languages at TSU offers a course in Georgian language to all incoming students for free. If they pass the exam successfully, they will receive 5 ECTS. In addition to Georgian, 40 foreign languages are taught by the Center for Languages and the Faculty of Humanities at TSU.</i>
<i>Sports and Culture</i>	<i>Department of Sports and Culture offers a wide variety of events for students to take advantage of. DSC provides students with football, basketball and archery facilities. Incoming students can join the university sports teams and take part in national competitions. Additionally, DSC offers students opportunities to learn about Georgian culture through events such as traditional dance lessons, concerts, as well as theatrical performances.</i>
<i>Student groups</i>	<i>A great way to make friends in a new academic community is to get involved in social and cultural activities organized by DSC, Students Self-Governance and the Erasmus Student Network in Georgia.</i>
<i>Jobs, career services</i>	<i>Student Career Development Centre at TSU provides consultations about the internships and career opportunities in Tbilisi.</i>
<i>Support and advice</i>	<i>Incoming students should contact Inbound Mobility Team if they have any questions or problems during their stay in Tbilisi. TSU Psychological and Training Center offers free counselling service to all English speaking international students of our university.</i>
